THE JEWELL INSTITUTE WILL BE FOLLOWING THE LOCAL DHM'S AND CREIGHTON'S COVID PROTOCOLS. The Dan Jewell Trial Institute is designed to help less experienced Nebraska lawyers enhance their legal skills necessary to try a lawsuit. Attorney participants have an opportunity to:

- Examine and impanel a six-person jury
- Deliver opening statements
- Call, examine and cross examine witnesses
- Produce deposition evidence
- Offer exhibits
- Review instructions and argue the case

Issues presented in the selected case, which involves a contested will, are (1) whether the decedent has testamentary capacity, and (2) whether the will offered was procured by undue influence. A Nebraska judge will preside over the trial.

Each attorney participant is assigned a mentor who will critique the participant's performance. Each trial will have two attorney participants representing the proponent and two attorney participants representing the opponent of the will, in this case.
